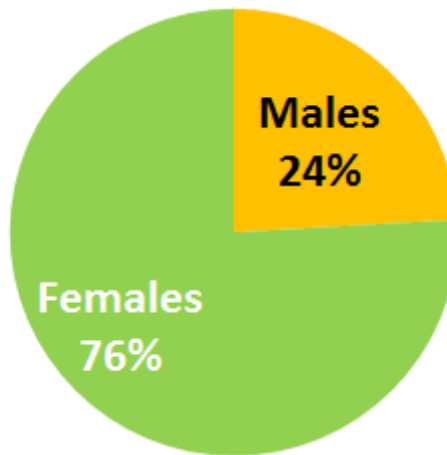
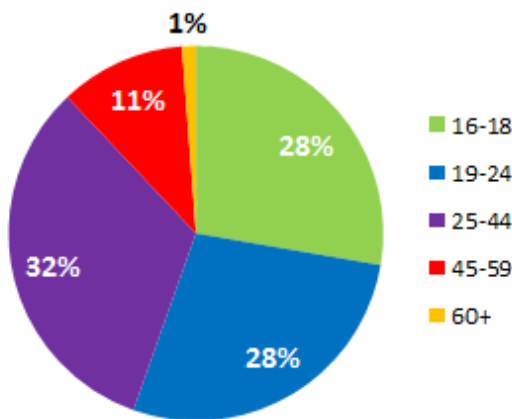

Would you like to teach an Adult Ed Course?



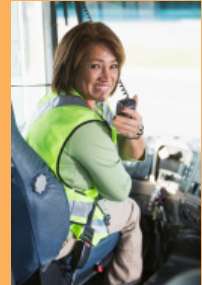

FAFSA

Federal Student Aid

The New Year is fast approaching, and it will soon be time to sit down and complete the FAFSA. If you are not familiar with the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), it is the primary application for financial aid and is probably the single most important thing you can do to get assistance in paying for college. The FAFSA needs to be filled out annually so that you can be eligible for the next year's aid. Even if you have completed it in the past, the FAFSA must be completed every year that you are attending school. It is important that anyone who will be attending school in the Fall of 2015 complete the FAFSA as early in January as possible. Since financial aid is first come, first serve, it is extremely important to submit the application as early in the new year as possible. Even if you do not have your tax information yet, students can estimate their tax information from their (and their parents, when relevant) last pay stub of 2014 or from the Federal 2013 tax return, and can be updated later.

PVAEC will be hosting a special **FAFSA Workshop** on **Friday, January 2, 2015** in two different locations. The first workshop will be in Dover-Foxcroft from 11am-1pm, and the second one will be in Dexter from 2-4pm. This workshop will help you file the annual application and provide an overview of financial basics. Discussion will include a review of the federal, state, school-based, and private funding sources. Upon completion of this workshop, the student will be able to effectively access the funding they need to complete their college degree. An emphasis will be placed on student responsibility and an understanding of the full financial process. Please call Leah (564-5883) for more information.

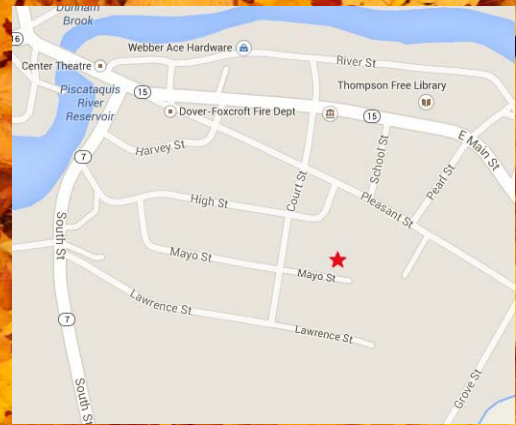
MEET THE INSTRUCTOR
